Soroptimist's Updated Brand – Who, What, How, and Why Elizabeth Payette, President (referenced from SIA)

SNR Governor Lane Parks attended our club meeting in October and shared the importance of Soroptimist's brand identity. She shared that in our four-county area there are more than 15,000 non-profit organizations who are all reaching out to the public to gain support for their respective causes. As Soroptimist has grown tremendously in its nearly 100-year history, it's more important now than ever to ensure that those with whom we interact as volunteers and solicit support have a clear

picture of Soroptimist: our mission, vision, tag line, and programs. In a nutshell, we need to say who we are, what we do, and how we do it.

Many of you have been in SI Sacramento for years. In Soroptimist early years we were referred to as service clubs that did a variety of projects in our respective communities. Important, but not aligned and focused. Now, Soroptimist is a global volunteer organization - a network of volunteers in more than 80,000 clubs and 130 countries. No longer are we merely a service club. Recently, the mission and tag line were updated to describe WHAT we are and WHO we serve. The **vision** remained the same: *Women and girls have the* resources and opportunities to reach their full potential and live their dreams. The **new mission** is: To provide women and girls with access to the education and training they need to achieve economic empowerment. The tag **line** is: "Investing in Dreams." The vision, mission and tag line speak to WHAT Soroptimist is and WHO we serve. Further clarification was provided by SIA about who we help. We serve women and girls that face obstacles such as poverty, violence and teen pregnancy. Please note this is an important update. We are no longer to refer to women and girls in our programs or who are the beneficiaries of fundraising as "disadvantaged" or "at-risk." It has been and may be perceived as demeaning.

The next step is to define the HOW. Soroptimist clubs accomplish the mission through financial support for and direct volunteer service in Soroptimist's signature Dream Programs: Dream It, Be It- Career Mentoring for Girls and Live Your Dream *Awards.* In addition, many clubs including ours, raise funds to give college scholarships to deserving women and grants to community non-profits whose mission is aligned with SI. We also participate in Random Acts of Kindness projects that help women and girls. To further brand the scholarship and grant programs, Governor Parks has recommended to SNR clubs with these funding sources to add "Dream" in its

title. For example, the Alice Smith <u>Dream</u> scholarship and the SI Sacramento Community <u>Dream</u> Grant. This reinforces that we are investing in dreams and helping women and girls' dreams come true. As we are soliciting funding from companies and charitable foundations for SIS, knowing that our signature Dream and scholarship programs are under the Dream brand is important so as to state that these are not pass-through programs.

I realize that the verbiage above may be a mouthful. It is more than simply calling SIS a service club that helps in the community. We are proud to be part of a global organization that is making a major impact around the world. And, locally SI Sacramento continues its 97-year legacy of making significant contributions that help women and girls in our community live their dreams. As ambassadors, let's strive to share the Soroptimist brand.
