Crab Fiesta - What's New? By Elizabeth Payette

This year's Crab Fiesta fundraiser's theme is "Investing in Dreams." It offers new and exciting features aimed at raising a record amount of funds to support our dream programs: Dream It, Be It, Live Your Dream, and the Dream Scholarship and Dream Community Grants. The "Why" behind Crab Fiesta fundraiser is to increase the number of women and girls we reach through our programs; together we can make dreams come true. The committee hopes that you'll be informed about the new features and share them with your guests, so everyone will be engaged, have fun, and gives generously. Here are highlights of the evening.

- The doors open at 5 pm. Encourage your guests to arrive during this social time for cocktails and to bid on silent auction prizes. Members with volunteer assignments should arrive no later than 4:30 pm.
- The banquet hall opens for guest seating no later than 6:15 pm with dinner service starting at 6:30 pm.
- The evening opens with a welcome by the emcee and recognition of sponsors and special guests from the Dream programs. Elizabeth will give a brief overview of our programs and share our goal about investing in the dreams of women and girls (raise funds!)
- There are two designated "Dream" tables: DIBI and LYD. The DIBI table will seat 3-4 Dream It, Be It student guests with their teacher, Moriah, and sponsors. At this writing, we are confirming that the Live Your Dream awardees will attend.
- Single Mom Strong and CASA (community grant recipients) board members and executives are attending.
- Our professional auctioneer is Cameron Mitchell and Melanie Hunter from Channel 3 serves as emcee.
- Your bid number will be printed on the back of the event program. This is your bid "paddle."
- The evening's flow is listed in the event program. After the Golden Ticket is pulled and dessert auction completed, the fast-paced live auction occurs. Raise the number on the back of your program to bid.
- A fabulous Mexico Beach Getaway is the last auction item. It's a 7-day vacation at winner's choice in Mexico at one of 5 locations Vidanta luxury resorts valued at \$4,550! Locations include Los Cabos, Nuevo Vallarta, Cancun-Riviera Maya, Acapulco, Puerto Penasco. You can buy more than one trip get one for yourself and to give another to a family member.
- Added this year is a Fund-A-Dream donation. It includes a special "mission moment" presented by Moriah T (SAVA DIBI) teacher. While she'll highlight the

students impacted by DIBI, the Fund-A-Dream donations will support all our dream programs. After the presentation, auctioneer will start the bidding at the highest level and go down through the levels. Guests bid by raising the number on their event program.

- 1st Level \$1,000; 2nd level -\$500; 3rd level - \$250; 4th Level -\$100
- We strongly encourage <u>all</u> SIS members to donate at one of the levels. Please tell your guests about Fund-A-Dream in advance
- Who can we count on to start the bidding by donating at the \$1,000 level?
- If payment has not already been collected via tablet immediately after the live auctions, guests will pay for any silent or live auction items at the Check Out table.
- Heads or Tails is the last game of the evening. To play, you must buy a bead necklace for \$20 - sold during social time and before the game. It's a game of chance with a several rounds of a coin flip. The last person standing wins a \$400 Amazon gift card.
- At the end of the evening, guest will be informed to place server tips designated envelopes distributed to each table at end of evening.

Guest Speaker – February 7 Human Trafficking Paul Durenberger



Paul Durenberger is an Assistant Chief Deputy District Attorney at the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office. Paul oversees human trafficking, domestic violence and elder abuse.

Paul chairs the "Sacramento Together" collaborative that brings together community agencies, county agencies and law enforcement together to improve our response to human trafficking victims. Paul is the Vice Chair of the Sacramento Regional Family Justice Center and runs their Camp Hope-America program for kids who have experienced family trauma.

Paul is married to retired Sacramento Superior Court Judge Marjorie Koller Durenberger.

Guest Speaker February 21 Women and Housing in Sacramento Angelique Ashby



Councilwoman Ashby is a graduate of Sacramento High School and obtained her B.A in Sociology with an emphasis on Law and Society from the University of California at Davis and her Juris Doctorate from the University of the Pacific's McGeorge School of Law. She owns a consulting firm with her dad in which they build programs for populations with barriers to success. She, along with her husband and three children, live in Natomas where she established herself as a leader and has served her community as an advocate for youth and public safety, creating infrastructure such as a police and community resource center and a new fire station.

Councilwoman Ashby's colleagues elected her Vice Mayor of the City of Sacramento for an unprecedented five out of nine years. Immediately following, the Council elected her to serve two full years as Mayor Pro Tem, a first for the City of Sacramento. Councilwoman Ashby was part of another first in Sacramento history when she became the first female on Council to have a baby while in office.

Our club selected Single Mom Strong (SMS) as a community grant recipient this year. SMS's mission is to empower single mothers and their children through enrichment, encouragement and educational programs. This RAK project helps with their third annual Valentine's Day dinner party where single mothers celebrate and love their life. The uplifting evening includes a program and catered dinner with wine and beverages, dessert, table favors, gift basket raffle, photo booth, music, and more. The children are entertained making craft gifts and cards for their moms in the adjacent childcare room and then join them after dinner for photo booth pictures, dessert, and fun.

This is a very popular event with 64 women plus their children expected to attend.

Three ways you can participate in this hands-on volunteer RAK project:

- 1. Donate items *in advance*. SIS is making table favor treat bags labeled with each Mom's name to note her table seat assignment. We are the dessert and wine sponsor and will donate a raffle basket.
 - a. Table favors: Please donate at least two \$10 Subway gift cards, two Chapstick lip balms (cherry or strawberry flavor), and one 10 oz or larger bag of silver foil wrapped Hershey kisses. We'll make 64 table favor bags each will have one \$10 Subway gift card, one Chapstick, and kisses.
 - b. Raffle Basket A basket with mom and kid-friendly gifts worth \$40-50.
 - c. Dessert and Wine Sponsor *Club members have already volunteered to donate as sponsors.

- 2. Meet up to assemble 64 favor treat bags on <u>Saturday, February 8th from 10–11:30 am.</u> With many hands, this will a fun, interactive time with fellow club members as we support single mothers in our community. - 3. Volunteer at the Love Your Life dinner and party on Friday, February 14th from 5:45–9:00 pm
 - a. Eight volunteers are needed to help at the event, but more are welcome.
 - b. Set up starts at 5:45 pm to put favors at place settings, wine on tables and arrange cookie platters. Then, at 6:30 pm greet mothers, serve beverages, dinner, and dessert, help where needed, and enjoy mingling and chatting with Moms and kids during the program and activities. If you can't come for set up, please arrive no later than 6:15 pm. SMS' board members and others run the event and volunteer, so you may leave early, if needed (around 8:15 pm).
