October 3 is acknowledged in Soroptimist as Founders Day. On this date in 1921, Soroptimists held the first board of directors meeting for the Soroptimist Club of Alameda County, followed by the first charter banquet in Soroptimist history. Violet Richardson was installed as the first club president. The Constitution of that first club stated the purpose of Soroptimist was "to foster the spirit of service..." That purpose and spirit of service still drives every Soroptimist club in the world. Here are the notes from that first Business meeting over 100 years ago.







More than a few times, I have been asked by friends and family "What does 'Soroptimist' mean?" The chosen name – SOROPTIMIST – was coined from two Latin words: SOROR and OPTIMUS. Soror = Sister: symbol of the bond of comrades and Optimus – The best, highest good. So, it became interpreted to mean "the Best, or the Highest Good for Women," and more popularly in recent years as "The Best for Women". (Source: The Past: Sierra Nevada Region publication)


I write reimbursement checks on Fridays, so you'll receive the reimbursement a few days later.

I chaired the Live Your Dream Committee for three years, the International & Goodwill Committee, the SOLT committee and the Program Committee. I have served, at one time or another, on most of our club's other committees. I am an enthusiastic supporter of building deeper friendships within our club and throughout the larger organization.

In addition to my Soroptimist family, I'm blessed with my devoted husband, Mark, and four wonderful children: Kali, Meghan, Jakob and Hana.
