
Celebrating Our Past

These were also the years of the Camellia Hat luncheons (she won the hat contest 7 years in a row!), fashion shows, and Christmas boutiques. She remembers hosting members to her home to make the Christmas ornaments, which were sold at the Christmas Boutique. We miss you, Georgia and wish you well in your new home---and we are thrilled that you are remaining with us as a member.
