Police Chief Kathy Lester Jan. 20, 2023 SIS Speaker

Be sure to attend the January 20th SIS meeting to hear the first female Chief of Police for the City of Sacramento, Kathy Lester, speak to our club.

Chief Lester joined the Sacramento Police Department in 1994 as a dispatcher, became a community service officer in 1995, and a sworn police officer in 1996. She has worked in Patrol, Traffic, Recruiting, Internal Affairs, Criminal Intelligence, as an Executive Lieutenant, and over saw police services for the Sacramento City Unified School District. She has also led the Contracts Services Division, Personnel and Fiscal Division, the Downtown Patrol Command and the Division of Outreach and Engagement. As a Deputy Chief, she has overseen the Office of Specialized Services and the Office of Operations. Talk about having "done it all"!!!!!

Chief Lester is a veteran, having enlisted in the army at the age of 17. She attended the Defense Language Institute in Monterey, Ca. where she became fluent in Russian, and served as a military interpreter, combat medic and range master. In addition, she has been an instructor in Crowd Control, First Aid, Community Relations, Gender Awareness, and Implicit Bias. She has earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from CSU Sacramento, and a Master of Science degree from Mississippi State University; As well as being a graduate of numerous special police science courses. She is also adjunct faculty for the Los Rios Community College District.

In addition to all of this, she is a wife and mother to three children and loves to cook, garden and fly fish. How does she fit it all in?

Come and hear about Chief Lester's current plans for the Police Department and her devotion to the concept of community-based policing, and to the "great people of the Sacramento Community."

I had the pleasure of talking with Nancy and finding out more about her background, personal life, and connection with SI Sacramento. From what I have gathered, many of you are SIS members because of Nancy. She is a great recruiter for our club and with her almost 40-year history of membership, it's clear that SIS is near and dear to her heart.

Nancy is a 4th generation Sacramentan, and she lives in the very house where she grew up in East Sacramento on 41st Street. Actually, there's an even more interesting story to that. Her parents were the first owners of the house when it was built in 1922 (Nancy was born a few years later). Her aunt and uncle bought the house next door, so everyone was near each other. Nancy's father was in real estate so was greatly impacted by the Great Depression as were so many. So, both families moved over to D St. and lived with Nancy's grandparents to ride out the Depression, and they moved back to 41st St. when Nancy was 2 years old. Eventually, Nancy married and moved out but inherited the house with her siblings when her parents died in the early 80s. It was a rental for years, but Nancy bought it out right in 1995, had it remodeled and moved in in 1996. She and Odell married in 1997 and they've lived happily ever since on 41st Street.

Nancy has three sons from her first marriage: Mike, Steve and Dan. Steve, Dan and their families are close by, and Mike and his wife are currently sailing in the Caribbean. She has one granddaughter who recently married. Odell has a son and three daughters so there is always lots of family around. In fact, when I visited her, I commented on the lovely Christmas decorations, and she told me her niece had come to decorate. So nice to have family helping out.

As you know, Nancy has been very involved with SIS for many years. She joined in 1983 when she was invited by the city clerk after she was elected controller. In those days, people had to be

invited and then were evaluated somehow before being asked to attend a meeting. In those days, the club was focused on community service so there were lots of different projects. She had fond memories of the early days when Georgia Presnell put on the fancy Cadillac dinners. She was shocked that the price of a ticket was \$150 (which included your chance to win a Cadillac) but they always sold out the 300 tickets and it was a night to remember with fancy clothes and a dance band. A few years later, a Polo event was held at Rancho Murietta; her son played on a polo team so everyone enjoyed the match, an auction and a meal. Odell and Nancy had a trailer than and would go out 2 days early to set everything up. When I was at the Development Retreat in Reno, someone saw my nametag and mentioned going to the Polo event. Small world!

In her working days, Nancy was an account auditor and a budget analyst, and she was elected as the first female controller for Sacramento County in 1982 and served for four terms. She retired before the end of her fourth term and was proud of what she had accomplished for the county.

When asked about her interests, she mentioned that she used to love gardening but 'it's hard to get down there now'. Yes, I agree! She's a member of a book club and loves to spend time with family. Nancy is a deacon at her church, Northminster Presbyterian Church.

Nancy and Odell love to travel and the two memories that stand out are Machu Picchu and the Great Wall of China, but they have been on many wonderful trips (several with Road Scholar). She said that it's hard to pick a favorite one because they are all different and every place has something special.

SI Sacramento means so much to Nancy. Our club has been a part of her life for almost half her life. Besides her strong belief in the mission and the work Soroptimist does, she has gained a broad circle of friends. She has stayed around for all these years because she has gotten as much out of it as she has contributed. Being an active member has given so much back to her. We're glad the city clerk invited you so many years ago, Nancy!

A huge THANK YOU to everyone in the club who worked a shift or two or three in order to make our first big fund-raiser since the pandemic a success. In all, 80% of our club members were able to work at least one shift. With a total of 48 shifts, that was very helpful. As we all know, Nancy Wolford-Landers spearheaded the See's store 14 years ago and procured various locations at Loehmann's Plaza. While we thought it wouldn't be possible this year as a real See's store was supposed to be in business in time for the holidays, delays made it possible for us to get a fantastic spot right next to the UPS Store. While we thought we were lucky to be next door to them, the UPS Store told our member, Pat Canterbury, that we brought business to them! So, it's a win-win for everyone.

Since it had been three years and prices were up, we weren't sure how successful a fundraising store would be. Because of that, we were a bit more conservative on our intial order so that we weren't stuck with too much candy. It turns out, though, that people love their See's, no matter the cost! So from the very first week, it was clear that sales would be strong. We went back to the See's store several times to get items as they sold out. As the month went on, product was becoming increasingly harder to get and since most of our stock was sold out, we closed the store on Wednesday, December 21st. We will sell the leftover (but still fresh) goodies at club meetings or contact Phyllis to put items on hold (See below for details) First come, first served! While final numbers are not in yet, we can estimate close to \$12,000 in proceeds for SIS and about \$1700 going to Soroptimists International of Sacramento South for their help. SISS is a very small club, so it's nice to have such a great partnership with them. Another win-win. Karen and I always knew that the See's store was a lot of work. Nancy, Mary Locke and Idelle Claypool had told us that. But you really don't get it until you do it. So, our hats off to all three of them for the years of service and dedication that they have put into running this fundraiser. All we can say is WOW!
