


President's Corner by Karen Smith

Mary has served on many committees (and we're keeping her busy as chair of Membership and Recruitment this year) and was president in 1996.

Mary has many wonderful memories of SIS including the Cadillac Dinner Dance, Crab Fiestas, Camellia Hat Festival and Dress-a-Girl. That was fun because several members brought sewing machines to her office at 400 Capitol Avenue and made dresses for girls (a pair of panties in the pocket.) These were sent to young girls in Africa. Everyone helped and often, Mary's daughter Abby would come along with her. Abby is now a young adult but was present at many of those SIS activities as a young child. Mary loves to cook and bake and often shares the wealth with friends and neighbors and some of the workers at the golf course.

Travel is a priority, and Mary is so excited about her upcoming trip to Paris with eight women – friends, her daughter and sisters - in May 2023. They are celebrating three years since Mary's bypass, and she is so grateful for the love and support they provided during her recovery. Mary comes from a big family (6 sisters and a brother). Her siblings live in the Bay Area so there are many visits to the bay as well as to SF to see her beloved Giants.

Mary is a dynamo who lives life to its fullest, and she adds wonderful energy and service to SI Sacramento!
