For Women's History Month this March, Soroptimist of Sacramento will be featuring our first 100 years at the Sacramento History Museum. To celebrate this honor and to kick off our Club's next 100 years, there is a reception, at the Sacramento History Museum, on Saturday March 23, from 4 pm to 6:30 pm. Dress to impress in optional 20's attire, which honors our Club's founding decade. Draw inspiration from 1920's suffragettes, drop waists, flapper dresses, to ostrich feather headpieces!

Live Your Dream






